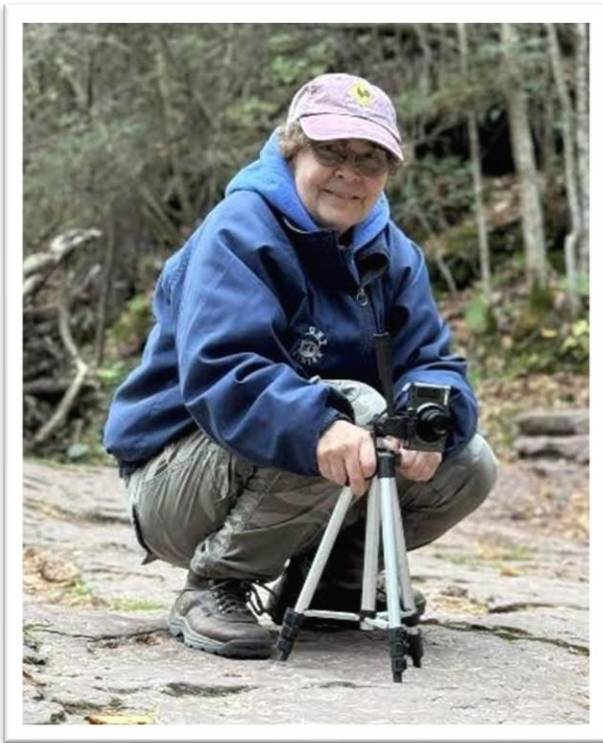

INTRODUCTION

The resting places of our ancestors hold a unique and irreplaceable place in the story of a family. Cemeteries are more than quiet landscapes; they are historical records carved in stone, preserving names, dates, and connections that might otherwise fade with time. This volume has been created to serve as a practical and guide for genealogists, historians, and family researchers seeking to locate the burial sites of those descending from Andrew Shiner.

By gathering these details into one reference work, the goal is to support the ongoing effort to preserve family histories and to honor the individuals whose lives form the foundation of our own. May this index serve as a helpful companion in your search for the stories, connections, and legacies that lie within these sacred grounds.

To make this information accessible and easy to navigate, cemeteries in this index are organized first by state, then by county, and finally in alphabetical order. This structure allows readers to move efficiently from broad geographic regions to specific burial locations, whether they are tracing a single-family line or conducting wider regional research.

Each cemetery section contains the city where the cemetery is located with GPS coordinates of the cemetery itself, along with pictures to help identify the cemetery and a map of the cemetery if one exists. An interment list is provided with each cemetery highlighting the direct descendants of Andrew Shiner in bold and italics. Other relatives, such as those that are married into the family or ancestors of those who married into the family, are also listed where appropriate. The relationship to a Shiner is noted by the designation listed in the following table.

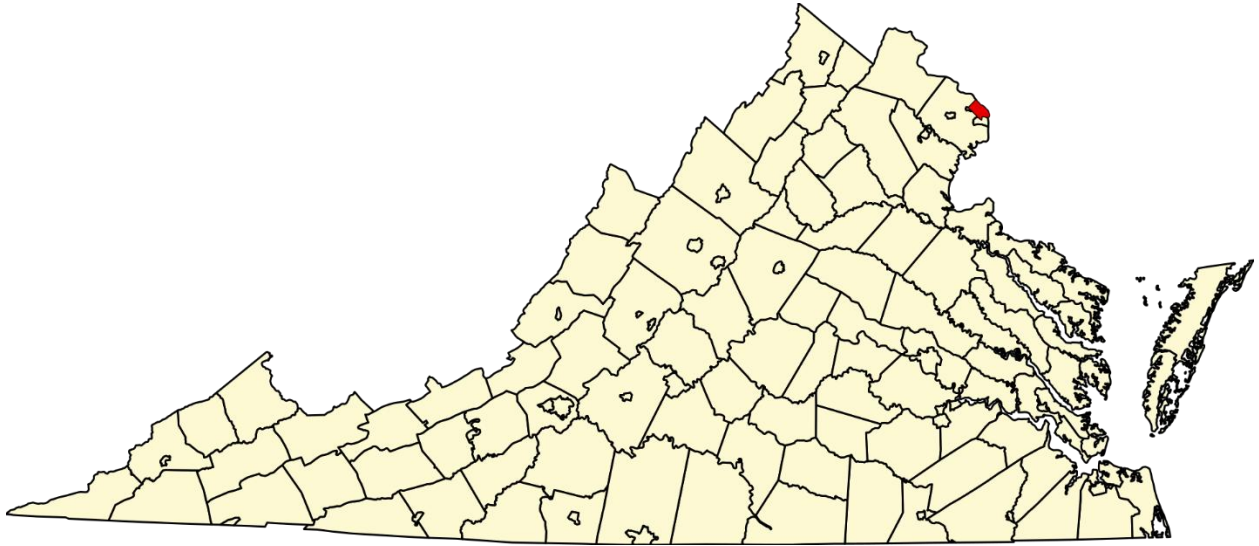

Arlington, Arlington, Pennsylvania, USA (38.87711, -77.06895)

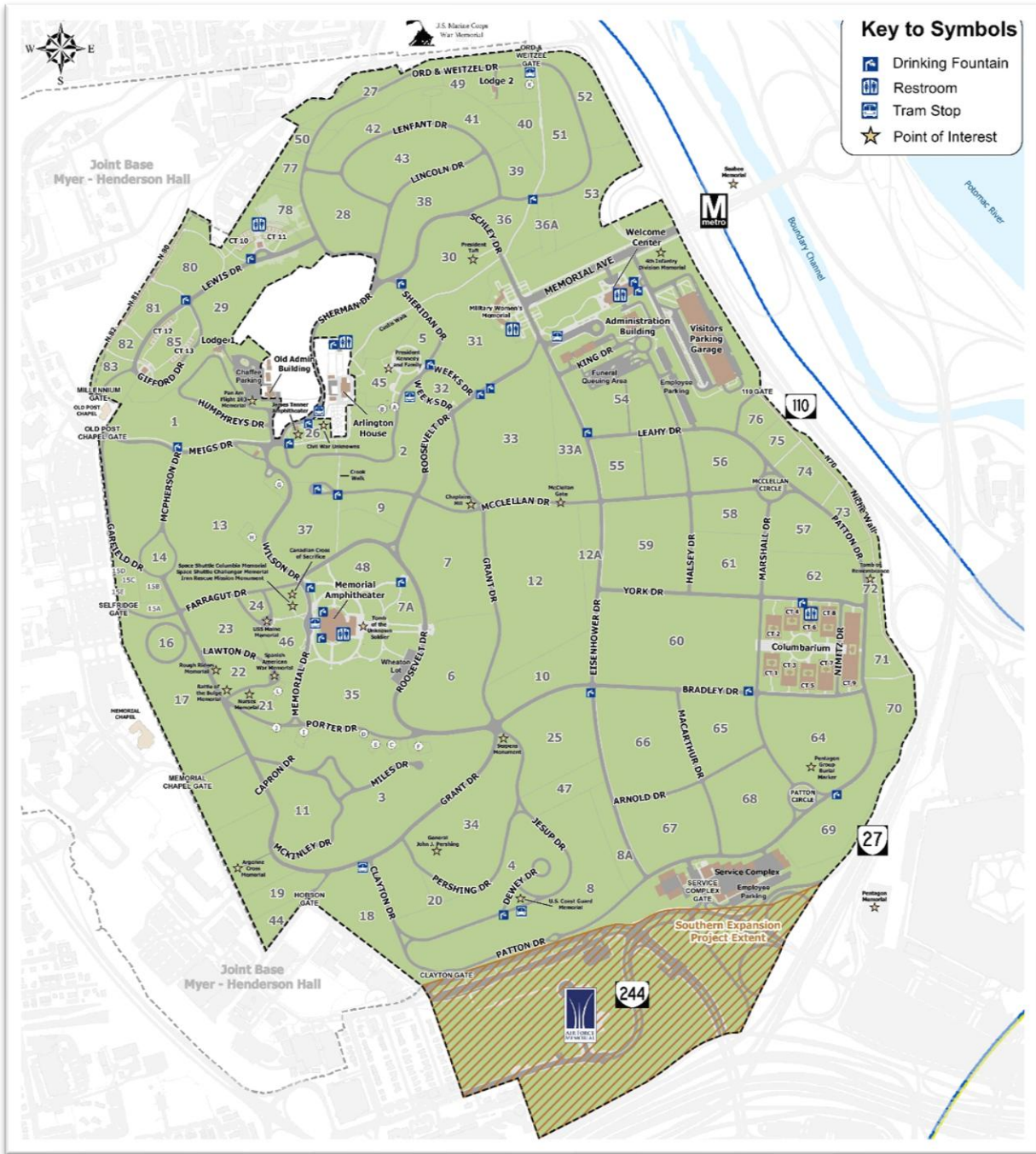
Arlington National Cemetery was established on 13 May 1864, during the American Civil War after Arlington Estate, the land on which the cemetery was built, was confiscated by the U.S. federal government from the private ownership of Confederate States Army general Robert E. Lee's family following a tax dispute over the property. The cemetery is managed by the U.S. Department of the Army.

This cemetery is the largest cemetery in the United States National Cemetery System, one of two maintained by the United States Army. More than 400,000 people are buried in its 639 acres.

Arlington National Cemetery has strict eligibility requirements to be buried here, generally requiring honorable service, death on active duty, or retirement from the armed forces. Key candidates include retirees, Medal of Honor recipients, and those with high-level decorations (Silver Star, Purple Heart). Spouses and dependent children of eligible veterans may also qualify.

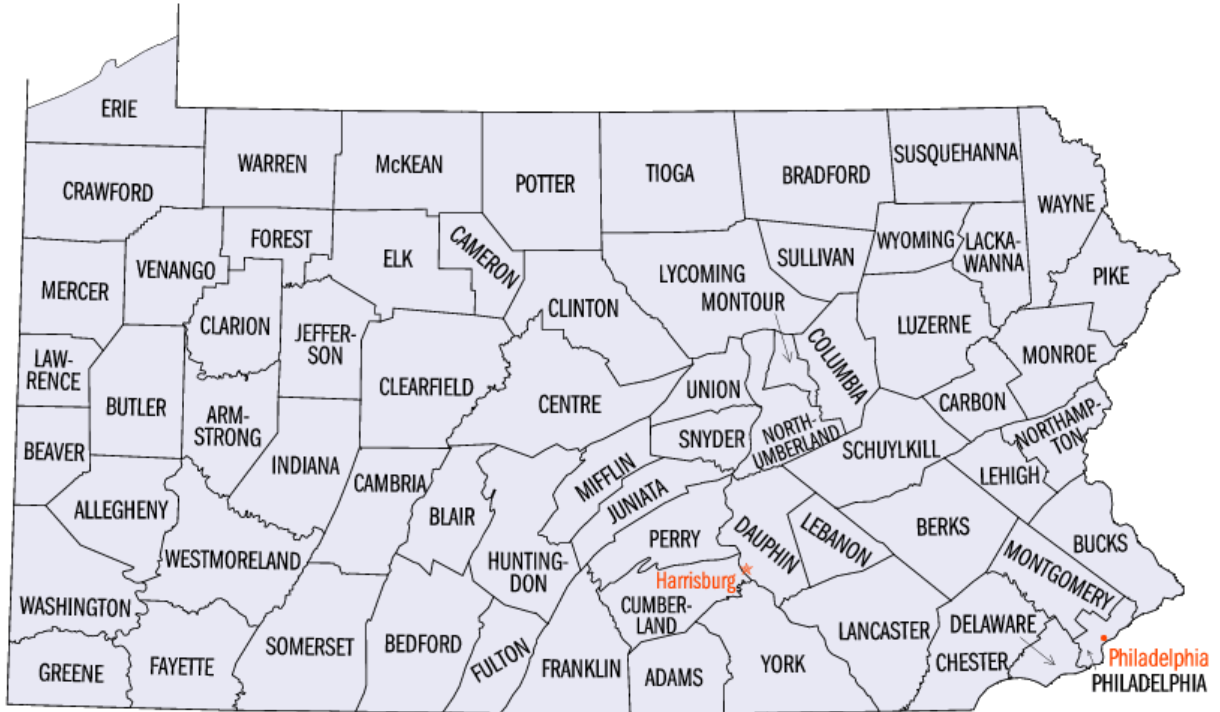


Andrew Shiner was born on Monday, February 28th, 1757, in Philadelphia, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, USA. Little is known about his child life and early adulthood. It is not known who Andrew's parents are.

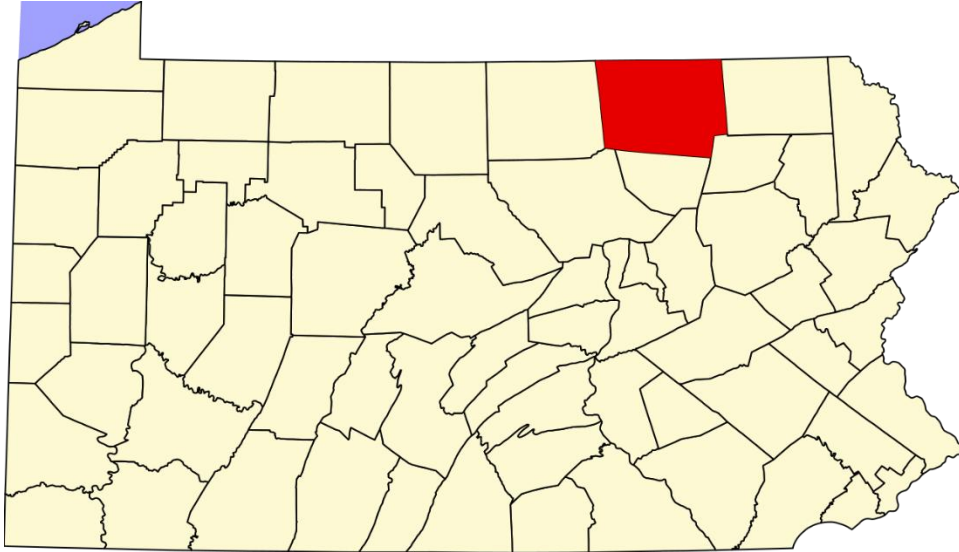
Andrew Shiner married Margaret Smith, daughter of Richard Smith, in 1775 in Northampton County. They had ten children: James, Rachel, Elizabeth, Hannah, Andrew Jr., Barbara, Evan, Richard, Peter and William.

Andrew was employed as a gatekeeper on the Berwick-Nescopeck toll bridge. He died in Berwick, Columbia, Pennsylvania, USA on July 7th, 1844, at the age of 87. He was buried in Berwick in 1844. Buried in the Quaker portion of the Pine Grove Cemetery. A headstone for Andrew exists in the center of the cemetery in the "Soldier's Circle" memorial, however, as a quaker his true burial location would have been an unmarked grave.

During the life of Andrew Shiner the state of Pennsylvania was still being formed to what it is nowadays.

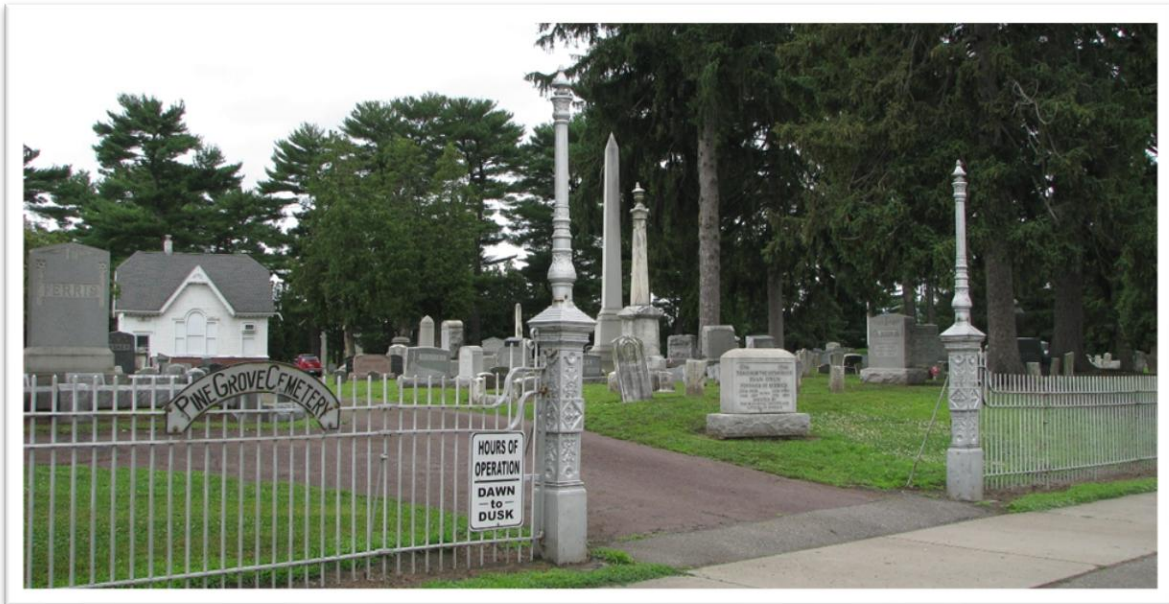

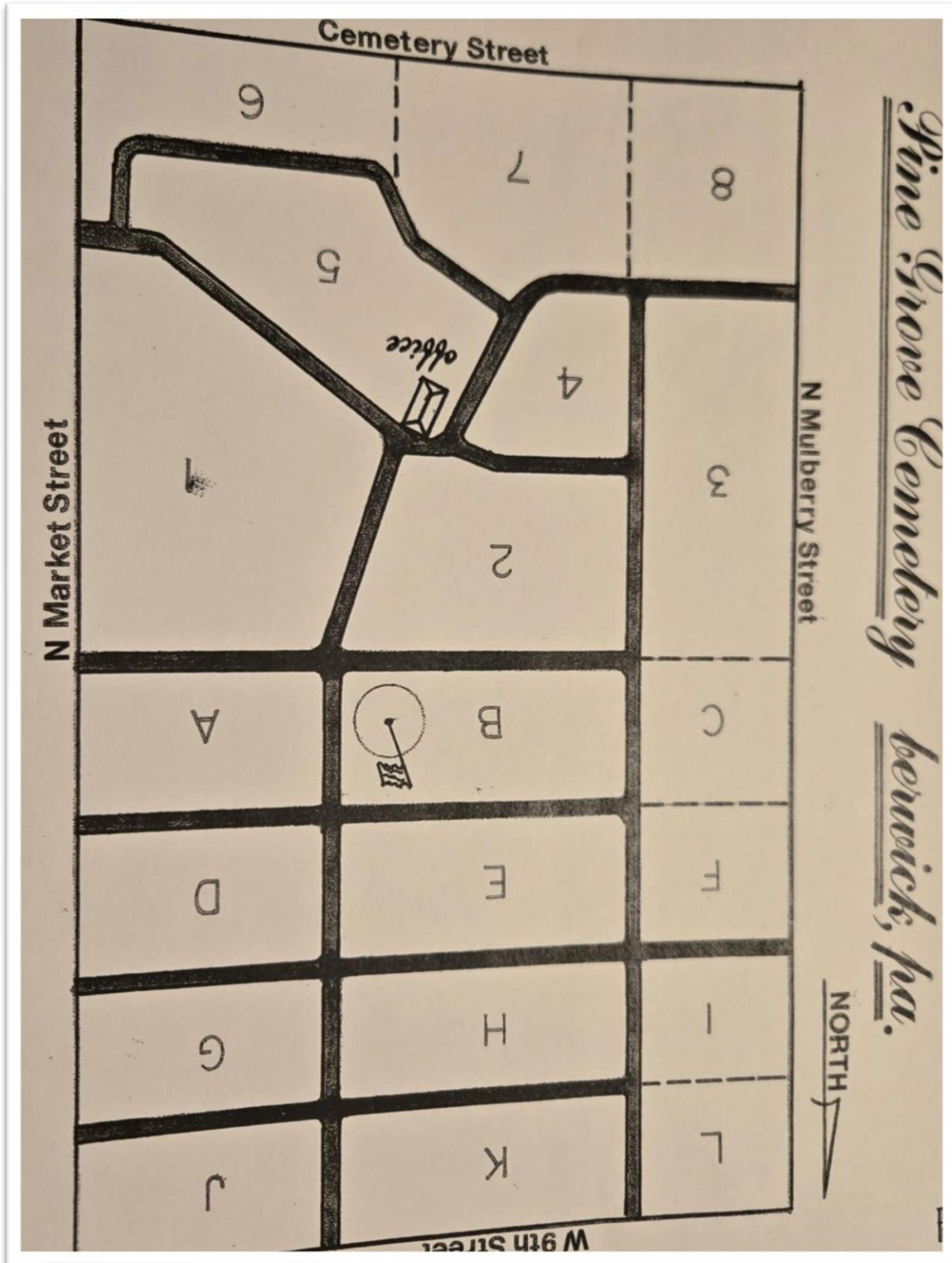
PINE GROVE CEMETERY

Berwick, Columbia, Pennsylvania, USA (41.05881, -76.23736)

This cemetery is in the center of Berwick, along Market street. There are over 7,000 burials known in this cemetery. Andrew Shiner (1) is buried in this cemetery, though his exact location is unknown. Being a Quaker, he was buried in the Quaker portion of the cemetery without a headstone. A headstone was later added to the cemetery for him in the center in an area known as Soldier's Circle that was create to honor those who fought in past wars.

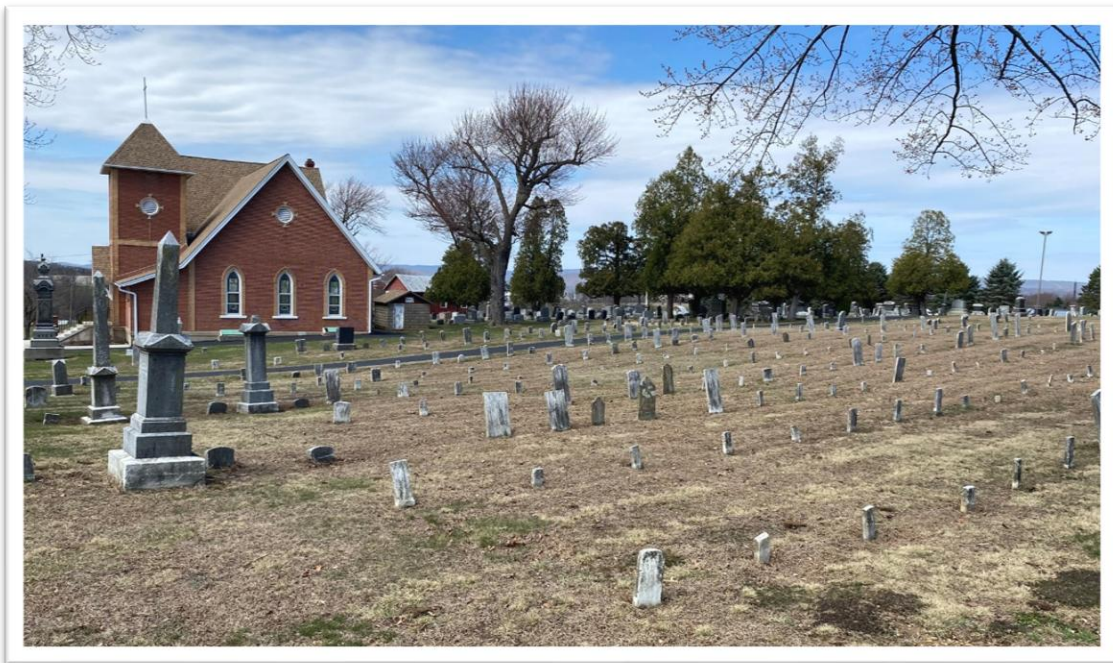

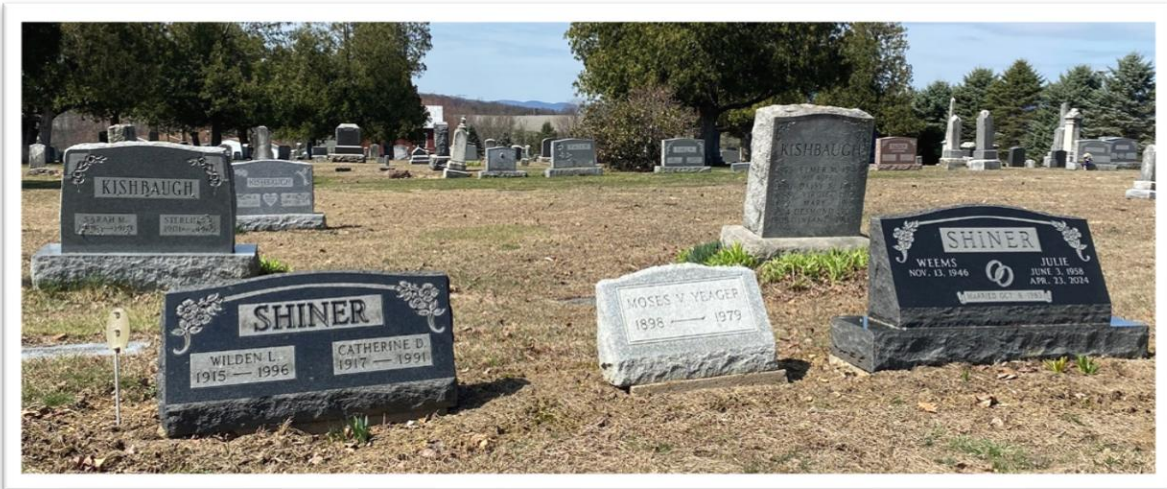

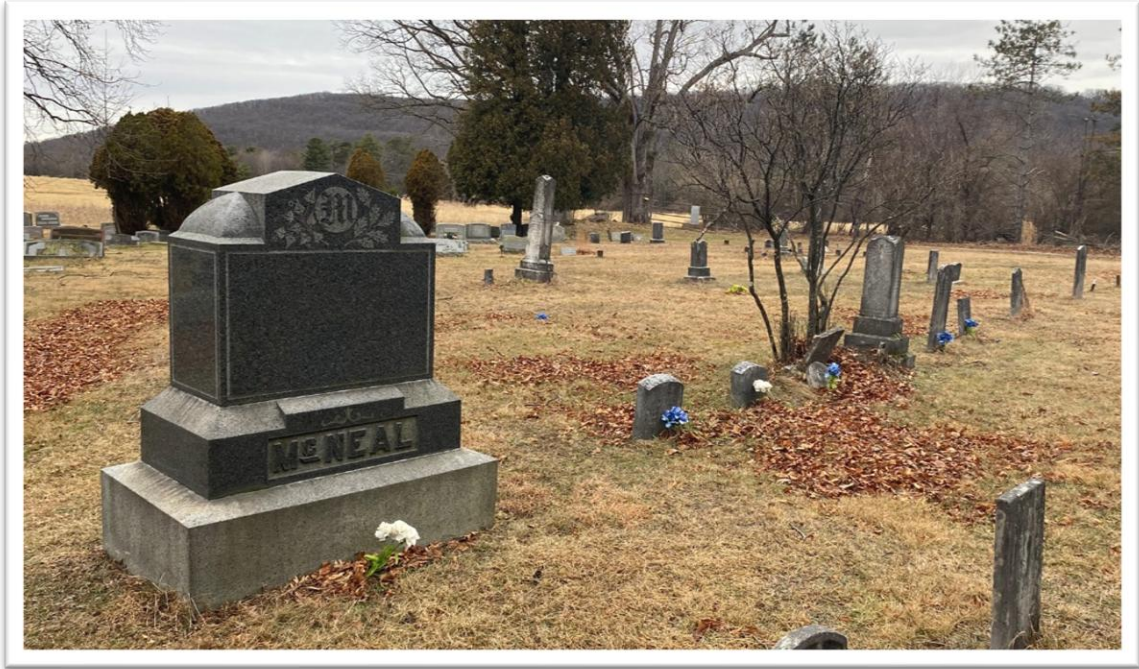

Located in Frankford, Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania between the Frankford Terminal and Wissinoming Park lies three cemeteries called North Cedar Hill Cemetery, (South) Cedar Hill Cemetery, and East Cedar Hill Cemetery. While technically connected to each other through name, they are three separate cemeteries. North Cedar Hill and South Cedar Hill are sibling cemeteries with lettered sections. East Cedar Hill, with its sections being numbered, was added as an extension to South Cedar Hill (the first recorded burial was in October 1887) and is on the opposite side of Frankford Avenue. Anyone who passed away before October 1887 who is found buried in East Cedar Hill Cemetery was reinterred from another cemetery.

If you are using Apple Maps, please take note that North Cedar Hill is currently marked as "Cedar Hill" where East Cedar Hill is located and East Cedar Hill is marked as "North Cedar Hill." South Cedar Hill (which is currently not marked on Apple Maps) is directly below North Cedar Hill (the two being separated by E. Cheltenham Avenue.) The open entrance to South Cedar Hill Cemetery is located on E. Cheltenham Avenue directly across from the entrance to North Cedar Hill Cemetery.

There are around 62,000 burials in this cemetery.

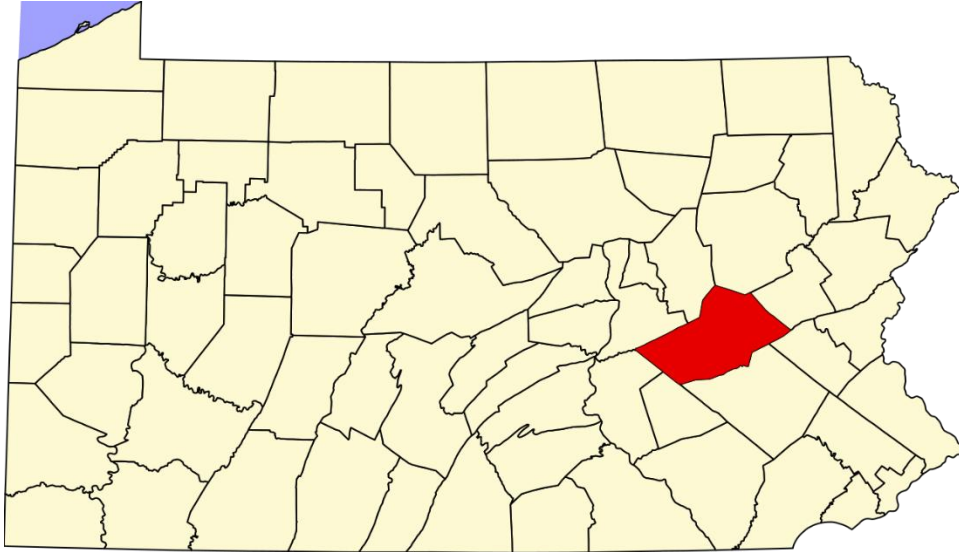

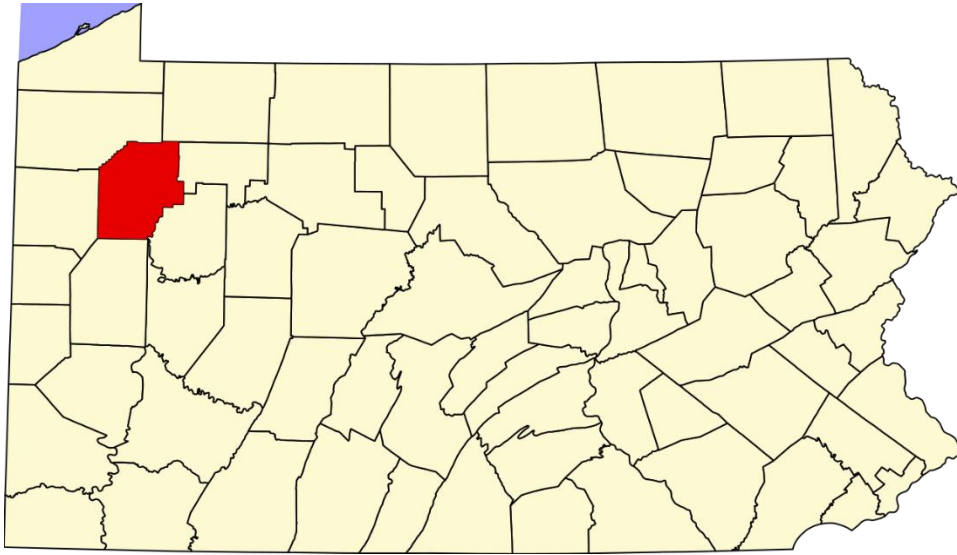

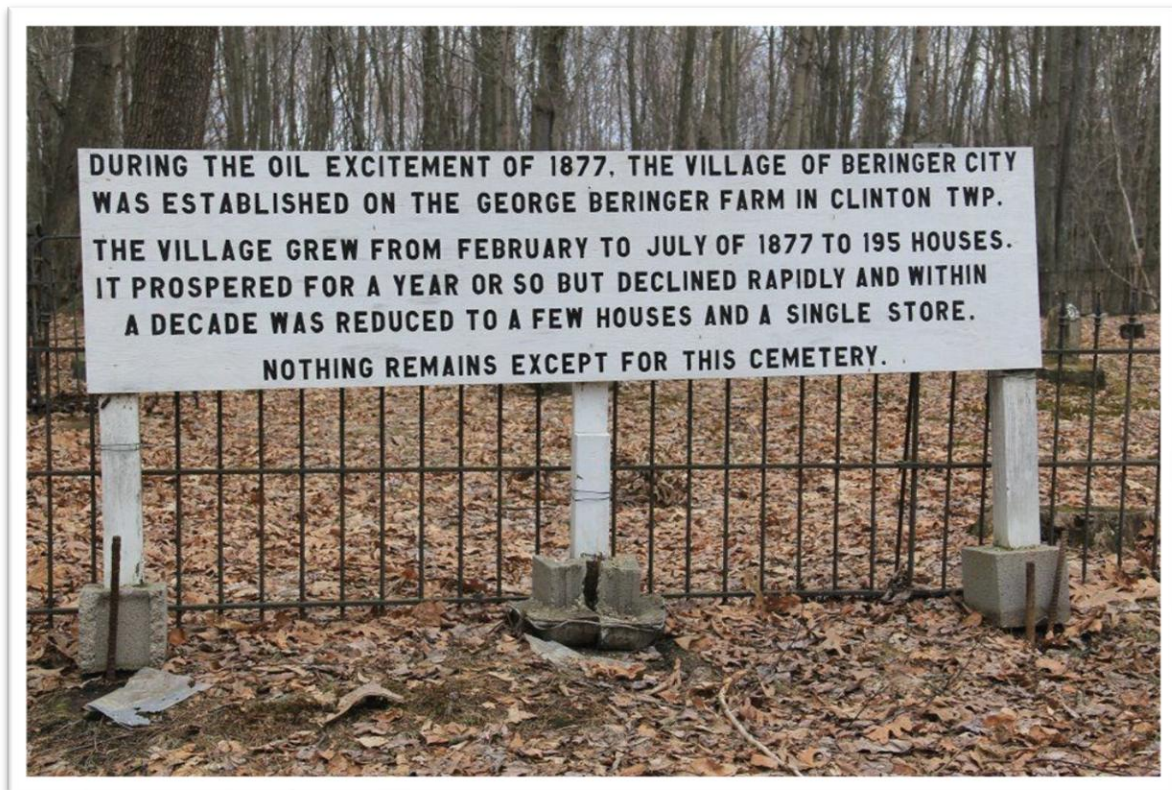
